Feast of Christ the King

Year A

26th November 2023

Dear Parishioners,

On this last Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King. In a world filled with various forms and types of leadership and authority, we look to Jesus as our true king, the one who reigns with love, compassion, and selflessness. The gospel passage from Matthew 25 presents a powerful image of Christ as the ultimate king and judge. He separates the sheep from the goats, not based on their wealth, status, or achievements, but on their acts of love and mercy. The king we honour is one who identifies himself with the hungry, thirsty, stranger, naked, sick, and imprisoned. He calls us to recognize his presence in the least of our brothers and sisters.

Ezekiel's prophecy paints a picture of God as the good shepherd, caring for God's flock. This passage reminds us that our king is not distant or indifferent but deeply involved in our lives. God seeks out the lost, binds up the injured, and strengthens the weak. Our shepherd-king knows each one of us by name and desires that none of us should be lost. Sounds nice doesn't it - but do you or can you draw comfort from this phenomenon?

As we celebrate today's feast, we are challenged to examine our lives. Do we recognise Christ as our king and allow him to reign in our hearts? Do we follow his example of humble service and selflessness in our leadership roles, whether in our families, communities, or workplaces? In a world that often values power, wealth, and success, Christ's kingship stands in stark contrast. He reigns not by force but by love. He leads not with arrogance but with humility. He serves not for personal gain but for the well-being of others. This is the kind of leadership that our world desperately needs.

As we honour Christ the King, let us surrender our lives to His loving rule. Let us allow Jesus to be the King of our hearts, guiding us in acts of kindness, compassion, and love. Let us be a community that serves the least among us, recognising the presence of our King in their faces. May Christ the King empower and strengthen you.

MEMORIAL GARDENS



OPERATIONS UPDATE

WHS (All Churches) - Our parish recently underwent a workplace health and safety audit, and we have been advised that our parish performance was very high. We have a few small areas we will work on and are just awaiting confirmation in writing before we proceed.

This audit focused on our procedures, and our environments, and was facilitated by a qualified external auditor. Several documents we provided the auditor were our 6 monthly fire extinguisher and fire blanket reports. All our churches are equipped with this equipment due



to candle use, and basic safety precautions. Early next year we will be providing additional training to sacristans (and any other parishioner interested) at each of the churches who may need to make use of this equipment. Watch the newsletter for details.

The parish office has air conditioners regularly cleaned (hospital grade cleaning) by an external company, and all electrical systems in all buildings are tested every 6 months by qualified electricians using a 'rapid injection test' to ensure our switch boards meet the relevant requirements. 

Communion from the Chalice

Gospel

On the First Sunday of Advent, we will reinstate 'communion from the cup' across the Parish. The Precious Blood will be offered at all weekend and weekday Masses. During COVID the communion cup was withdrawn as a precaution and this is the first time our parish is reinstating it. Several months ago, I asked parishioners if they were ready for the cup to return and there was an overwhelming yes, however some parishioners expressed concerns, especially some Communion Ministers who would normally consume what is left after communion.

Everyone will need to make their own decision if they wish to receive from the cup, and Communion Ministers are asked to contact the Parish Office if they have concerns consuming what remains after communion. We will be offering 2 cups



Mark 13:33-37

at each Mass, and there will only be a small amount of wine put out. My preference is that the cup runs out toward the end of communion, so there is no Prescious Blood remaining. We are also reminded that Jesus Christ is 'whole and entire' under both the form of bread and under the form of wine. We can choose to consume the Host, or the Host and Precious Blood, however no matter the choice, we still receive the body, blood, soul, and divinity of our Lord regardless.
