

1st Sunday of Lent Year B 18th February 2024

Dear Parishioners,

A few reflections to begin LENT 2024: - "Lent comes to make its prophetic appeal, to remind us that it is possible to create something new within ourselves and around us, simply because God is faithful, always faithful, for he cannot deny himself, he continues to be rich in goodness and mercy, and he is always ready to forgive and start afresh." —Pope Francis

THE HOPE OF LENT is more than our hope that we will get through it, that we will come to the end of it. We can see Lent as an obstacle course we need to navigate in order to get to



the great feast of Easter. But while the Lenten season is indeed preparation for our Easter celebration, the hope of this season is that we will find our lives transformed by the many ways we encounter God's word, by the richness of the Scripture readings chosen to encourage, to challenge, to confront, to comfort.

Focusing only on the end goal would cause us to miss so much along the way. Lent is not only about penance, deprivation, spiritual struggles, and rooting out sin in our lives. Those are often the things we do during Lent. The greatest hope of Lent lies in what God does. Lent is a time to discover the extraordinary in the ordinary, to be surprised by God's mercy when we least expect it. As the season begins, think about the hopes you have for Lent this year. Think about what changes you want to see in your life, in the world. Let the words of Pope Francis guide you on a journey of bringing those hopes to fulfillment.

There's something attractive about Lent beginning in the middle of an ordinary week, catching us in the midst of our daily occupations and asking us to take time out to find God there. Lent does not take us away from our ordinary lives, but rather it invites us to bring a new and holy attention to those activities.

"Let us allow ourselves to be wrapped in God's mercy which comes to meet us; as we keep our gaze fixed on the passion and death of the Lord, let us receive in our heart God's boundless love and, in silence, await the resurrection." —Pope Francis

Often the best way to understand the love of God is to reflect on what we would be willing to do for someone we love dearly, or what another would do - or has done - for us. Never forget that human love is an image of divine love.

"Prayer is like speaking with a friend: In prayer, one opens one's heart. Following his face-to-face with God, Moses went down the mountain reinvigorated, saying, 'I got to know the Lord better.' And that strength allowed him to resume his work of leading the people to the Promised Land."—Pope Francis
My hope for you is that these 6 weeks, you will get to know the Lord better!

Pope Francis reminds us that our faith is rather a love affair, a dream, a joyful, passionate embrace that doesn't stop to ask about worth or merit or judgment. When we are caught up in the ecstasy of love, we lose our tendency to stand outside ourselves and consider each action, each thought. When we can bring this to our faith life, we discover the wonderful things God has in mind for us, for our loved ones, for our future.

Please make the most of this beautiful time in the Church year: use it well; remind yourself of, and even rediscover, God's love for





CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERED (ATRIUM)

MINISTRY FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

The Catechesis of the Shepherd is a Christian formation process for children between the ages of 0-12. The central aim of this process is to help a child nurture their own personal relationship with God. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is grounded in scripture and liturgy of the Church framed by the Montessori method, using hands-on sensorial materials of education. It is a sacred space where children are welcomed to enjoy an environment that encourages and nurtures their natural curiosity to know God more deeply.
