

#### Dear Parishioners,

Every year I look forward to Lent, although I'm not sure why. I grew up in a Parish where Lent was a community affair – we had Stations of the Cross on a Friday night, Benediction, and Father would give us all an ice-cream for coming to prayers on a Friday night – maybe this is where I got my love for ice-cream! Everyone, adults, and children, tried "giving up something." Although one girl in my year six class gave up her little brother, most people denied themselves some culinary delight (except for the ice-cream). Lent was a deep breath that you took, held for six weeks, and let out at noon on Holy Saturday. Can you relate with this?

There is also the hope for some slight signs of improvement. I am always on the lookout for a better self. Lent triggers an "I can do better" tape within me and connects with my early childhood memory of The Little Engine That Could: "I think I can, I think I can, I think I can...." [Remember Thomas the Tank engine?].

A New Yorker cartoon shows two men in a dungeon without windows or doors. They are manacled to the wall by their wrists, ankles, and neck. Both have long beards; they have obviously been there a while. One is leaning over to the other and whispering, "Now here's my plan."



This cartoon recently made me laugh and when I have described it to others, they laughed. There is something essentially human about a burst of hope in a hopeless situation. It shows us who we are: people without a way out who are planning a way out. Where does this deep hope come from?

Václav Havel, the former president of the Czech Republic, was once asked, "Do you see a grain of hope anywhere in the 1980s?" He began his lengthy answer with, "I should probably say first that the kind of hope I often think about, especially in situations that are particularly hopeless, such as prison (e.g., the manacled planner), I understand above all as a state of mind, not a state of the world. Either we have hope within us, or we don't; it is a dimension of soul, and it is not essentially dependent on some particular observation of the world or estimate of the situation."

Hope is not a response to what we observe or how we estimate what is going on. Hope is an inner quality we bring to life. Our Church, our Parish and I am guessing you as well need hope. As we enter this season of Lent, may hope be real for you and may that hope be found in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. I am looking forward to Lent – but as I write this, I am looking forward to sharing in your hope for a better Parish. Have a great week,



# THIS SUNDAY - 11th FEBRUARY 2023

Gospel

WORLD DAY OF THE SICK - This Sunday will pay tribute to the invaluable work that Catholic health institutions undertake not just in Australia, but around the world. In his message to mark the 32nd World Day of the Sick on February 11, Pope Francis reflected on the way serious illness could cause vulnerability, uncertainty, and insecurity. This year's theme is "It is not good that man should be alone", taken from the Old Testament book of Genesis. "The first form of care needed in any illness is compassionate and loving closeness," Pope Francis said in his statement. "To care for the sick thus means above all to care for their relationships, all of them: with God, with others – family members, friends, healthcare workers – with creation and with themselves.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD - This ministry is offered each Sunday at the 9:00am Mass at St Mary's, Woodend. The children leave the assembly at the beginning of Mass and return for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Our priests will invite children forward at the appropriate time during the Mass. Parents are also invited to attend if they want to come along to see what it is all about. Just come forward with your kids!

## **CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERED (ATRIUM)**

#### MINISTRY FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

The Catechesis of the Shepherd is a Christian formation process for children between the ages of 0-12. The central aim of this process is to help a child nurture their own personal relationship with God. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is grounded in scripture and liturgy of the Church framed by the Montessori method, using hands-on sensorial materials of education. It is a sacred space where children are welcomed to enjoy an environment that encourages and nurtures their natural curiosity to know God more deeply.
