Dear Parishioners,

We normally take great pride in making our own decisions. As we age, this becomes more real \mathfrak{S} . When we did this as children, it was a sign we were growing up; as adolescents, it was a proclamation of independence. Now as adults, when making decisions, we demonstrate we are self-directed. The problem doesn't seem to lie in decision making itself, but in the options given to us. And there is the rub. Often these options are not of our choosing. This can cause decision-making to be very difficult.

Today's Gospel is all about making decisions. Options are placed before us. We either choose Jesus and the extraordinary way of life he has outlined for us, or we go along with the movements of society. This could include making money at any cost, denying hospitality to those who knock on our door, or harbouring an attitude of superiority over others. We either choose to live in the light with the insights our faith provides, or we simply accept the values that bombard us each day through the media, namely: Me first. What's mine is mine. What's in it for me? Not in my back yard.

If we look carefully, we will realise the way of life Jesus promotes is based on the dignity of each person, who is made in the image and likeness of God. Actions that dismiss, demean, damage, or destroy human life are contrary to the teaching, life, and example of Jesus. Accepting his way brings forth a new society called "the reign of God." Rejecting it will likely keep society as is. Which will it be for you? You decide! It is worth me saying again, even if only for my own ears: We either choose Jesus and the extraordinary way of life that he has outlined for us, or we go along with the movements of society.

OPERATIONS UPDATE

Mass Boxes – Each week several volunteers from across the parish come to the Parish Office on a Friday to collect the Mass Boxes for each Mass. These boxes contain the reader's folder, presider's folder, newsletters, and several other items needed for the weekend. Generally, they will be taken to each church and set out ready for weekend Mass. Often we also have notes for Coordinators, Sacristans, and Computer Operators. If you serve in one of these 3 ministries, please look out for important information that may assist you.



Mass Box Volunteers – When you arrive at the church, please go through the box, and set out important notices for the weekend. If you do arrive at the church and the alarm is off (some churches have alarms), that is perfectly fine, they will often be off because our schools use our churches. They are aware that Mass Box Volunteers are usually out on a Friday afternoon. Thank you to our Mass Box Volunteers for helping us prepare for Mass each week!



Ministry Rosters – Over the next 6 weeks, we will be reviewing all volunteers and their assigned ministries to ensure they are up to date and reflect the preferences of our volunteers, and to see if we need more volunteers in any area. The recent roster process helped identify some gaps where availability listed against some volunteer records may have been out of date. To ensure we do this accurately, volunteers with emails (98% of our volunteer group) have been emailed a list of their ministries and the Mass we have them attending. It is important that each volunteer confirms this information and advises us of any changes.

If we don't hear back, we will assume the information is correct and your roster coordinator will continue to use this information for the next roster period. Volunteers without an email listed will be contacted by phone so we can confirm your details.

Finally, I want to point out that sometimes the roster isn't right the first time. Managing preferences of 300 volunteers with 7 Masses each weekend is not an easy task, and our staff and roster coordinators put a lot of time in preparing the rosters. Please be mindful of the time the team puts in, and don't take your frustrations out on them. We are a big Parish with lots of moving parts, and any problem, no matter how big or small can be fixed. We just need the time to look at the roster and chat with other volunteers to make any changes. Thank you to everyone who does volunteer, we know it can be hard on you too, your time and talents are an integral part of parish life, and you are an essential part of the team too!

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERED (ATRIUM)




All groups are preparing for the Easter celebrations with various presentations and materials. The younger ones (0-3) explored the landscape model of Israel and heard the names of the three major cities of Nazareth, Bethlehem and Jerusalem. This work highlights that Jesus was a real person in a particular time. The Prep and year one children were very busy looking after the environment by dusting and watering the plants in the Atrium. They were also presented with items that are used in the Mass i.e. the Chalice, Paten etc.

The Primary school aged children worked with the large wooden model we have of the City of Jerusalem, while listening to the Passion story of Jesus, and identified the various buildings Jesus was taken before he was crucified. Some of the children are also reflecting on the different versions of the Passion and Resurrection stories as told by the Gospel writers. All these activities in the Atrium serve as an invitation to and preparation for the liturgical life they will share with adults in the Church. The catechists prepare the environment, and the preparation becomes the prayer of the adult with the children. The sessions for the Prep and Primary school age children are full for this term. However, if you are interested in enrolling for term 2 please contact the Parish Office for details.


