2nd Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

Dear Parishioners,

If I had to choose a single word that captures the essence of Catholicism for me, besides Jesus himself, it would be "mercy." The years 2015 and 2016 posed extraordinary challenges for me for various reasons, with the most daunting one occurring in early 2016 when I was tempted to give up my faith. To be frank, I stopped attending Sunday Mass for a while, denying myself the spiritual treasures that I could have received from Jesus. Instead, I focused on my personal well-being.

However, I gradually began to feel a sense of emptiness creeping in, an emptiness that prayer and the Eucharist usually filled, which started to profoundly impact my outlook on the future. It was during this period of crisis that Pope Francis declared the

Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy from 2015 to 2016. He articulated mercy in numerous contexts, one of which was "opening our hearts to the hope of being loved forever despite our sinfulness." The Pope elaborated on this, saying, "even in our moments of sinfulness or when we deny God's love, His mercy continues to embrace us." What I discovered was that Christ even allowed me to step back from His embrace so that I could see the full extent of His love: always reaching out to me with hands extended in hope.

The Church commemorates Divine Mercy Sunday on the second Sunday of Eastertide. Though we rejoice in the Risen Christ, uncertainties about our spiritual journey and future linger. In such uncertainties overshadowing us, we keep questioning the Lord, even with harsh words. Nevertheless, our Lord always listens to us as he did to St. Thomas in the gospel reading today. The thorough listening and openness to us are expressions of His Divine Mercy.

As we conclude the Easter Octave, we obtain another significant joy: the joy that Jesus always opens his hands to us, offering us His mercy. Let us wash ourselves in His tender love and mercy this weekend and beyond so that we may confidently profess our faith again as Thomas did. Amen.

The blue depicts the breath of the spirit giving life to every decision and action of the Church and of our lives.





FINDING THE HOPE IN EASTER

During a visit to Croatia in 1994, St. John Paul II famously stated, "Do not abandon yourself to despair. We are Easter people and Alleluia is our song." Again in 1986, he referenced these words, prefacing it with the following clarification that I think sheds light on our situation:

"We do not pretend that life is all beauty. We are aware of darkness and sin, of poverty and pain. But we know Jesus has conquered sin and passed through his own pain to the glory of the Resurrection. And we live in the light of his Paschal Mystery – the mystery of his Death and Resurrection."

To celebrate and live as "Easter people" does not mean that we ignore suffering or pretend that it doesn't affect us. Rather, suffering is necessary to the rejoicing, because it is through the very transformation of this suffering that the joy becomes meaningful, so unlike anything the world has known. Easter cannot exist if not in the context of great suffering.

After all, the Apostles spent their Good Friday and Holy Saturday much like ours: scattered in their homes, afraid, and facing many unknowns. Easter takes on such meaning because of this suffering, not in spite of it. Christ transformed their fear and sorrow into rejoicing, even when joy seemed the most impossible.

VINNIES QUARTERLY REPORT

St Joseph's Conference assisted 160 adults and 163 children this quarter. The total financial assistance given was \$8,780.32. This consisted of \$5,175 in food vouchers, \$100 in chemist bill, \$973.48 in school supplies and \$2,531.84 from the Children's Education Fund. We provided vouchers for our Vinnies store of \$425 and \$1,550 in furniture from our Vinnies warehouse and donated items.

Food hampers distributed were valued at \$2730. These hampers are only possible due to your generous donations of proceries each week. Parishioners have asked what is best to donate. Our hampers are made up of very basic food items. We endeavour to give enough for 3 nights meals. Here is the list of what we try to place in the bags - CEREAL, LONG LIFE MILK, PASTA OR RICE, NOODLES, TINNED TOMATOES, BAKED BEANS OR SPAGHETTI, TINNED MEALS, SOUP, SWEET AND SAVOURY BISCUITS, TINNED FRUIT, TEA OR COFFEE AND SOAP AND TOOTHPASTE. We are also very grateful for your financial donations - envelopes marked St Joseph's Conference are available from the welcome desk. May God bless you all for your continuing generosity.

St Mary's and St Barbara's Conferences assisted 387 families in the Ipswich and Rosewood area during the guarter. We provided \$53,939 in direct financial assistance such as food vouchers, purchasing second hand household appliances and assisting with some rent and other bills. This amount included \$14,059 to around 20 families to help with back to school expenses such as uniforms, books, and stationary supplies and in some cases laptops and printers. We also provided \$6,020 in clothing and furniture through the Vinnies store and Vinnies warehouse, as well as \$9,123 in other In-Kind donations, including the food donated here at the parish churches each Sunday.

The St Vincent de Paul Society is guided by a document called The Rule. The Rule is used to articulate the Society's vision and guide how it carries out its good works. On the first page it gives a very clear and unambiguous statement about the Vincentian vocation. "The vocation of the Society's members, who are called Vincentians, is to follow Christ through service to those in need and so bear witness to His compassionate and liberating love. Members show their commitment through person-to-person contact. Vincentians serve in hope."
