Dear Parishioners

Advent, (which begins in four weeks) is, in part, about waiting and preparing for a baby. Christians love the stories and the images of this baby, born in a place for animals, lying in a manger, the sweet hay breath of cattle and sheep filling the air - not to mention some less pleasant aromas, courtesy of the woolly creatures. But the expected baby will not remain a rosy-cheeked plastic figure in a manger scene. Babies become toddlers with opinions, teenagers with even more opinions, young adults who move on with their lives...or not. When we love a baby, we love all that the baby will become, even that which is not so easy to love.

It is 800 years since St Francis brought the story of Jesus birth alive to the people of Greccio – he literally said that from this manger comes the presence of Christ to the people. From the manger (the timber box) Jesus is born – he is made flesh – he is like us in all things but sin! From the manger then comes hope, love, joy, peace, From the manger comes the presence of God in our Lives. This baby, born in the manger, who will be known as the Son of God, will grow to be the wise and gentle teacher of the gospel. He will beckon us to pay attention to his example. He is poor; he relies on God alone. His message is for all the earth, not just "the chosen." A cross will be involved. And, with that cross, the promise of resurrection. It is from the manger that God comes into our world – what comes into your life 'from the manger'?

The wood of the manger is the wood of the cross. To love this baby is to love God's people - all of them - and sometimes to accept the suffering that loving others brings. Saint John defines God as Love and writes about him: "No one has ever seen God. Yet, if we love one another, God remains in us, and God's love is brought to perfection in us" (1 John 4:12). Jesus' commandment to love God and love our neighbour echoes in our hearts. If we can obey this most important commandment, then we are promised "peace...like a river" (Isaiah 48:18).

From the manger comes so much Our theme or focus for Advent 2024 will be 'FROM THE MANGER ...' My hope is that from the manger our Parish is enlivened to make Jesus real in so many ways in our lives. On the 1st December, the Ipswich Catholic Community turns 5! We have been a Parish for five years From the manger we draw on the strength of Jesus who is made flesh! From the manger of your heart, so much can happen!


truth. Do so openly and with joy. If you do, others will discover in you the truths of God that they need and will be invited to imitate your truth-seeking in their own lives.

Keep quarrels and bitterness far from them, and for their occasional failures instill forgiveness and peace.



PRAYER ON THE ROAD - One of the earliest accounts of Francis, the "Legend of Perugia," quotes Francis as telling the first friars, "You only know as much as you do." His emphasis on action, practice, and lifestyle was foundational and revolutionary for its time. For Francis and Clare, Jesus became someone to actually imitate and not just to worship. Up to this point, most of Christian spirituality was based in desert asceticism, monastic discipline, theories of prayer, or academic theology, which itself was often based in "correct belief" or liturgy, but not in a kind of practical



Christianity that could be lived in the streets of the world. Many rightly say Francis emphasized an imitation and love of the humanity of Jesus, and not just the worshiping of his divinity. That is a major shift.

Those who have analyzed the writings of Francis have noted that he uses the word doing rather than understanding at a ratio of 175 times to five. Heart is used 42 times to one use of mind. Love is used 23 times as opposed to 12 uses of truth. Mercy is used 26 times while intellect is used only one time. This is a very new perspective that is clearly different from (and an antidote to) the verbally argumentative Christianity of his time, and from the highly academic theology that would hold sway for the next thousand years. He took prayer on the road and into the activity of life itself.
